OUR MISSION To Invite Everyone to know God's Love through our community of Faith



Normally you expect some uplifting Advent/Christmas message in the newsletter. But there are times when it is god to take a moment and remember that though the kingdom of God has been proclaimed, it is here and not yet. It is always but coming. And until it reaches its fullness, we must work for a fairer and more just world. By the time you read this, the church will have held a special charge conference and will have voted on authorizing church leadership to discern whether we accept the settlement plan for the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) lawsuit. The lawsuit arose out of the sexual abuse within the BSA cases that have come to light. A class action lawsuit is (on behalf of those who have been abused) underway to extract monetary damages for the victims. Our church, as well as several other denominations that have had long standing associations with the BSA have been named as co-defendants by virtue of their having chartered troops or offering space for troops to meet. We voted to allow our insurance company (and by proxy their lawyers) to handle our defense, and shield individual churches from being sued. It's a tawdry and ugly process.

I, like other clergy I have spoken to, am very uncomfortable with the notion of letting lawyers decide what is just compensation, just damages if you will for the victims. Many lives have been destroyed by the predatory behaviors of men who were supposed to be trusted mentors and leaders of societies greatest treasure, our children. Money will not mend the shattered lives of these former scouts. So, in my moments of frustration with the process of administrating my two church charges through this litigation, I have stolen moments to stop and reflect on the emotional toil that has been unfairly inflicted on the innocent. I try and keep in mind that the facts and figures are just that. They do not accurately represent, nor tell the story of the very human tragedy that has occurred. In the weeks, months and years to come, try and remember the victims and the damage done to them. Pray for their healing. Pray too for their abusers. This one is harder, but Jesus commands us to "love our enemies and pray for them." In a very real way, these abusers are broken, and likely beyond the human ability to repair. Only God can mend what has happened. Our hearts should be filled with compassion for everyone involved, and not resentment or anger. Let this Advent/Christmas season fill your heart with compassion and mercy.


BIBLE STUDY

MACC's Community Kitchen

Planning on inviting friends and family over for the holidays? I have been using this recipe for years, it's super simple and you can substitute some of the ingredients. These crispy, tangy, and creamy bites of love have become an **instant hit** at my gatherings. Often I've substituted fig jam; guava paste or even just caramelized onions for the cranberry.

Cranberry Brie Bites

Ingredients

Original recipe yields 24 servings 1 (8 ounce) round Brie cheese, rind removed As needed cooking spray 1 sheet frozen puff pastry, thawed ½ cup cranberry sauce ⅓ cup finely chopped walnuts sea salt to taste

Step 1

Place Brie cheese in the freezer for 20 minutes. Oil a mini muffin pan with cooking spray.

Step 2

Roll 1 puff pastry sheet out into a 10x14-inch rectangle. Cut the sheet lengthwise into 4 even strips and crosswise into 6 even strips; there should be 24 squares. Separate and press them gently into the muffin cups.

Step 3

Cut chilled Brie cheese into 24 pieces approximately 3/4-inch in size. Add 1 teaspoon cranberry sauce to each pastry-lined muffin cup; press in 1 piece of Brie and top with 1 teaspoon of chopped walnuts. Sprinkle bites with sea salt. Chill for at least 30 minutes and up to 3 days.

Step 4

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C).

Step 5

Bake bites in the preheated oven until golden brown, 18 to 20 minutes.

Cook's Note:

Placing the Brie cheese in the freezer for 20 minutes makes it easier to cut.
