Dear Siblings in Christ,

This month a special; session of the General Conference of the United Methodist Church will convene to attempt to find a way forward after many years of bitter infighting over the full inclusion of our LGBTO siblings into the life of the church. May the Holy Spirit move our Bishops and the General Conference to a place of repentance, and an opening of hearts and minds to God's will.


