Ad Council Minutes 11/10/25

Attendance: Maria Genca, Marti Baskerville, Ed Parsons, Laurie Parsons, Dorothy Larson, Marion Knight, Dorothy Tuthill, Pam Schipani, and Pastor Tara.

Minutes from previous meeting were presented. Dorothy Tuthill made a motion to accept, Maria seconded, motion passed.

Treasurers report was received. Maria made a motion to apply \$1737 from dinner towards credit line, Pam seconded, motion passed. Discussion was held on taking the additional \$300 from Mt. Zion's rent and putting in the savings account for church maintenance. Dorothy Tuthill made a motion to do this, Maria seconded, motion passed.

Marion reported for trustees on the endowment. Morgan Stanley \$15,078.91 and Doris Wells is \$15,103.61 for a total of \$30,182.52.

Mt, Zion has signed the new lease. They need more storage space. Ed has been working on this and feels he needs some shelving units to fix the issue. He was given the go ahead.

The DS advised that if we send them our event flyers they will share with other churches in our district. We talked about having a work day to get the church in shape for the holidays.

Ed advised that there have been water issues with parsonage/Epworth. It is expected that we will need to replace the pump. Marion made a motion to pursue and get it fixed, Maria seconded, motion passed. Ed has spoken with Ted about the electrical issues and was pursuing getting it fixed.

Marti advised that Pastor Tara is running an Advent Bible study. We will be able to participate via Zoom. The book she is using is The Unlikely Advent by Rachael Billups.

Dorothy Larson made a motion to adjourn, Pam seconded. Motion passed
